- Understand and apply music technology tools and various sound production techniques for both instrumental and vocal music.
- Apply knowledge of music pedagogy to design and deliver effective lessons tailored to different learning styles and age groups in music education.
- Communicate musical ideas effectively through written, oral, and performance-based presentations.
- Collaborate effectively in interdisciplinary and cross-cultural artistic projects.
- Demonstrate knowledge of the music industry, including concert programming, promotion, and copyright issues.
